## IMPORTANT MEDICATION INSTRUCTIONS

If you have a history of coronary artery disease and if you have had stents, angioplasty, PTCA, or bypass surgery, continue to take your medicine on your regular

schedule even if your medicines are listed on this sheet unless your physician specifically instructed you otherwise. For medications you take in the morning, be sure to take them at least two hours before your test. (Sometimes there are exceptions in which case your physician will have advised you to take some of your medications. If that is the case, bring your medications with you and you can take them after the test.) If your physician has not given you specific instructions, continue to take your medications on your regular schedule—even if listed below—if you have a history of coronary artery disease and if you have had stents, angioplasty, PTCA, or bypass surgery.

## If you do not have a history of stents, PTCA, or bypass surgery,

look carefully at the medications listed below. If you are on any of the medications listed, DO NOT take them the day before and day of your test.
